# Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals (CMS)

- UN Environment treaty
- Only global legal instrument for conservation of migratory species of wild animals
- >1000 species of avian, aquatic and terrestrial fauna
- Species that cyclically and predictably cross one or more national jurisdictional boundaries

- Strict protection










As of 1 September 2019 the Convention on Migratory Species has 129 Parties.



Scoreboard to assess the progress in combating illegal killing, taking and trade of wild birds (IKB)

A self-assessment framework for national use

 provides national governments with a tool to provide an objective, fact-based selfassessment of the current status of illegal killing of birds at national level







### Type of data: 5 Critical areas and 28 Indicators

- A. National monitoring of IKB 4 indicators
   (including number, distribution and trend of illegally traded birds)
- **B.** Comprehensiveness of national legislation 9 indicators
- **C. Enforcement response** 6 indicators
- **D. Prosecution and sentencing** 4 indicators
- **E. Prevention** 5 indicators

**After 2020:** Assessments will take place every 3 years synchronized with CMS COP



## First Assessment of the Scoreboard - 2018

- Sent to 53 countries
- 30 replies received
- Presented at the Joint Meeting in May 2019
  - Some responses were partial
  - Not all information was available for every country
  - Additional information was shared by some countries



Average score (percentage of maximum possible score) for each indicators' group



## First Assessment of the Scoreboard - 2018



#### Some important outcomes:

- Collecting of data was complex and challenging for countries
- Responses based on partial information in many cases
- Collaboration with NGOs was important to complete data
- Prosecuted cases often provided as all collected data
- Missing taxonomic information
- Specific databases in place/under development only for some countries

Joint Meeting of the Bern Convention Network of SFP and the CMS MIKT Rome, Italy 8-10 May 2019





#### **Vision**

By 2030, reduction in the scale of IKB by 50% within their national territories (Europe and particularly the Mediterranean region), over the 2020 baseline, aiming ultimately at the eradication of IKB.

## **Objectives**

- 1. To understand the extent of and motivations behind illegal killing of birds
- 2. To ensure that the illegal killing of birds is incorporated effectively and efficiently in **national legislation**
- **3.** To ensure that effective and efficient **enforcement** of relevant legislation is undertaken
- **4.** To ensure effective and efficient **justice** for IKB-related offences
- **5.** To **prevent** the illegal killing of birds

### Outcomes of the Workshop



- Individual and concerted efforts at strategic level are needed to address the issue
- Specialist prosecutors greatly enhance the fight against IKB
- Specialized police forces, adequately trained/equipped and work on the ground, greatly increases success
- National commitment by the relevant governmental ministries and departments, with underpinning of modern and effective legislation
- International cooperation is vital
- Addressing wildlife crime requires specific training
- Intensification of international cooperation beyond the European network
- Legislation requires improvement in some countries





## MIKT's role



To facilitate **concerted efforts and procedures** to combat illegal killing, taking and trade of migratory birds in the Mediterranean Region;

## Working to eradicate IKB



Illegal killing, taking and trade of migratory birds is a serious threat not confined to a single region or country, it is **globally** 

widespread.
