


IMPEL: a network of practitioners since 1992


IMPEL's mission:

'to contribute to protecting the environment by promoting the effective implementation and enforcement of EU environmental law'



IMPEL helps:

- **Countries get to compliance more quickly**
 - sharing knowledge, skills and good practices, peer reviews (IRIs)
- **Organisations to implement strategies to use their limited resources more effectively**
 - by producing technical guidance and promoting the use of risk-based approaches to target effort
- **Coordinating action between countries**
 - enforcement of regulations to tackle illegal trans-frontier movements of waste
- **Facilitating communication between different actors and networks**
 - prosecutors, judges, ombudsmen, international networks
- **Informing policy with practical experience and expertise**
 - Feed the regulatory process with outcomes of IMPEL activities



LIFE SWEAP Project – Interim results



- Inspection Data Reporting App: test version ready in October (tested at TFS Conference) 
- Online capacity building platform (launch Oct)
- Online visualisation tool Spotfire used to analyse and visualise inspection data
- Industry survey (102 responses) - Industry information package being prepared
- Joint operations with the WCO
- GPS trackers purchased

LIFE SWEAP Project – Interim inspection data

Inspections June 2018 – June 2019

- Admin inspections 2776
- Physical inspections 9658
- Waste 5412
- Admin violations 165 (6% hit rate)
- Physical violations 2248 (41.5%)


Violations by Destination Country


LIFE SWEAP Project – Destination regions




LIFE SWEAP Project – 2018-2019 Violations to non EU contrnies

Strategic Project to Increase the Detection and Disruption of Environmental Crime in the Western Balkans

- Conducted by IMPEL
- Jointly financed by the EU and the Federal Republic of Germany
- Grant agreement between IMPEL and GIZ
- Part of a larger project: Countering Serious Crime in the Western Balkans
- Time: July 2018 – December 2019



SPIDERWEB Project - Aim

Increase awareness and skill set of all actors in the enforcement chain to prevent, detect and prosecute Wildlife and Waste crime in the Western Balkan, by:

1. Baseline research in 6 beneficiaries
2. Training needs assessment in 6 beneficiaries
3. Deliver small scale practical training nationally, involving all relevant authorities
4. Developing and providing an online Training toolkit
